# Satan's Greatest Deterrent to Hospitality Your standard of comparison

We most often compare our perceived weak points to others' strengths and feel inadequate because we get "caught up" in "keeping up" with the "Jones'."

We often compare our house, our talent, our social status and even our heart to that of others and feel too inferior to entertain.

#### Try Imagining:

The poorest little village in Mexico (or anywhere your imagination allows) where the average family lives in a 10' by 10' one room shack made of pieces of old board, tin and even cardboard. The floors are dirt. Six people live in the single shelter. There is no running water, no electricity, no bathroom, no sink or shower, no stove or refrigerator, no laundry machine, no windows or door, no beds only a blanket for each member to curl up in on the floor and the furniture is nothing more than chunks of wood to sit on.

Now visually transport your dwelling place into the middle of that village complete with your electricity, air conditioning, running water, lights, bedrooms, TV and Stereo, table and chairs, carpet, furnace, hot water tank, windows and locks on the doors. Do you still feel poor and inferior? "Well not exactly."

Why not?

The only thing that has changed is your standard of comparison.

#### Ask yourself:

Now that I'm the "Jones" in town, will I be more hospitable?

It is very doubtful because since you couldn't be trusted where you are, why now would Jesus entrust you with more compassion?

Matthew 25:21 "His lord said unto him, Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord."

# If you have more than Jesus had, you have more than enough.

## Do you have a house or place to meet?

# W.W.J.D<u>.</u> What Would Jesus Do?

#### If Jesus would have had a house:

- The hungry would have been fed there
- The thirsty would have been given drink there
- The homeless would have lived there
- The sick would have been nursed back to health there
- The naked would have found clothes there
- Those in prison would have received letters from there
- The neighborhood children would have played there

#### If Jesus would have had a house:

- It would have been furnished with:
- Chairs He found broken and discarded and then fixed with glue and nails
- A table made from some weathered boards found at a demolition sight
- Pictures drawn by kids from the orphanage He visited daily
- Plants He dug out of the ground and put in flawed pots He got free from a potter
- Miss-matched dishes and cooking utensils He scrounged up at yard sales and flea markets
- Beds He found in the dumpster behind a newly renovated inn with quilts He was given by some old ladies at the nursing home

#### If Jesus would have had a house:

- He would have served all a simple meal of maybe cooked beans, rice or corn since He could go to a farm after harvest and glean and dry sacks of produce

#### If Jesus would have had a house:

- It would have had a big welcome mat at the front door on which were written the words, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest".

## If you have a place to live, and you do what Jesus would have done,
